He guided the successful implementation of the community-driven action plan in his role as Chair of the Committee for the Thunder Bay Remedial Action Plan from 1989 to present. The plan resulted in the successful environmental cleanup of the Northern Wood Preservers site in Thunder Bay Harbour with the area of concern extended to address the water quality of Lake Superior along the Thunder Bay waterfront.

Agricultural organizations or associations are also invited to put forward nominations for the "Economic/Industry" Sector of the Committee. Application deadline is November 5, 2007.
