

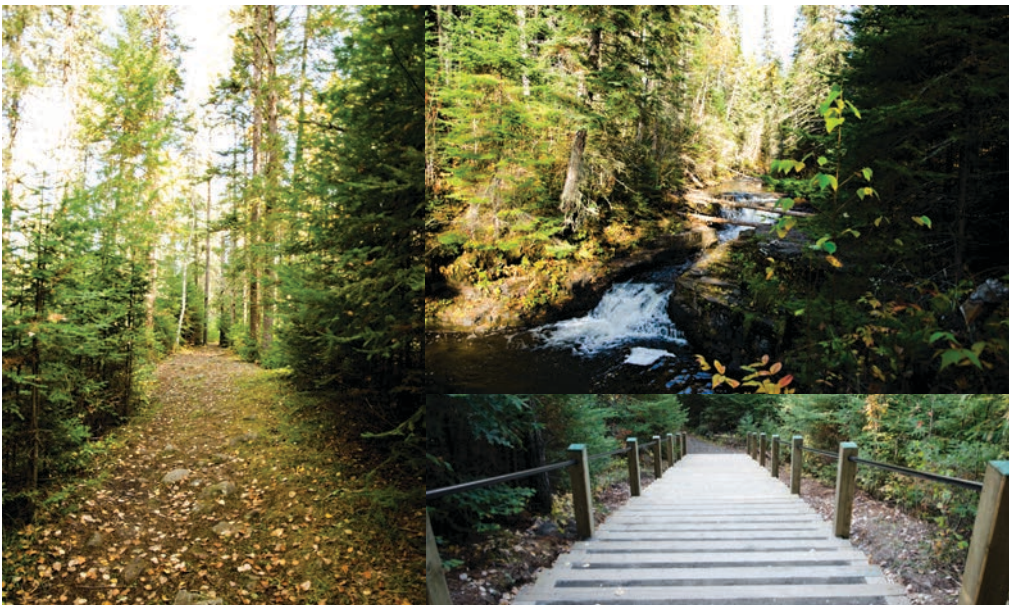
CEDAR FALLS

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A picturesque, cascading waterfall nestled in a lush, ever-green forest thick with undergrowth

A cascading waterfall, lush evergreen forest and thick moss undergrowth are some of the picturesque features found at Cedar Falls Conservation Area. A pleasant walk along a well-marked trail leads visitors to Cedar Creek and the falls. Fish for rainbow or speckled trout, bird watch or enjoy the solitude of this quiet, charming area.



 **DIRECTIONS:**
Cedar Falls Conservation Area is located at the end of Broome Road. From Thunder Bay, head towards Kakabeka Falls Provincial Park on Hwy 11/17. Turn left onto Hwy 590, then left onto Garbutt Road, followed by another left onto Broome Road.
